Student Feedback on Subject

Ghatal Rabindra Satabarsiki Mahavidyalaya has conducted a thorough analysis of student feedback on various academic and infrastructural aspects. This report encapsulates insights from diverse semesters and courses, highlighting students' perspectives on syllabus completion, workload, topic relevance, and more. The feedback, derived from both undergraduate and postgraduate students, serves as a vital tool for institutional development.

1.Completion of course:

A total of 43.7% of students reported that between 70% to 84% of the syllabus was covered, 26.8% of students reported with 80% to 100% of syllabus being covered while 19.9% of students reported with 55% to 69% of syllabus being covered. The figure indicates a satisfactory level of course completion, with scope for further improvement.

2. Workload on the subject:

With 21.8% of students finding the workload to be extreme, another 44% of the students found it to be moderate while 22.7% of the students considered the workload to be somewhat moderate and the remaining 9.4% of the students reported very little. This data indicates that the workload distribution require optimization.

3. Relevance of the topic covered:

A total of 44% of the students found the topics covered to be moderately relevant whereas 21.8% of the students considered it to be highly relevant, while 22.7% of students found it to be somewhat relevant and the rest 9.4% found it to have somewhat or little relevance in the real scenario of life. suggesting a curriculum that is largely aligned with student expectations and industry standards.



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4. Remedial Classes:

With 18.2% of students considering the remedial classes to be effective to a great extent. 44.6% of students considers the remedial teaching as moderate in effectiveness, 24.4% find it highly somewhat beneficial, pointing to a positive impact on student comprehension.

5. Transparency of internal assessment exam:

With 19.2% of the students rating the transparency of internal assessment to be excellent, 42.1% of the students rate it as good and 30.7% of the students considered it to be very good, reflecting a level of trust in the evaluation process.

6. Institution Initiatives:

About 31.2% of students recognize the college's efforts in promoting internships students exchange programme and other practical exposure opportunities, which are essential for holistic education. While 44.4% of the students were neutral. This indicates that the college should promote more such activities and opportunities to the students.

7. Academic Confidence:

A majority of 61.1% of students feel that their coursework has bolstered their confidence to undertake more advanced studies, indicating effective academic programs.

8. Overall Academic Experience:

With 14.4% of the students indicating that they are highly satisfied with their academic experience. 40.5% of the students considered it to be satisfactory. This reflects that the overall academic environment of the college is satisfactory.

9. ICT Facilities:

With 46.1% of students satisfied with the ICT facilities for syllabus coverage, and 44.1% finding them moderate, there's an indication that ICT support is adequate but could be enhanced.



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
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
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10. Courses on Soft Skills, Life Skills, and Employability Skills:
